Know that Andy Warhol was an American artist who was a leading figure in Pop Art Know that Andy Warhol explored the relationship between artistic expression, advertising and celebrity culture. Know that Pop Art aimed to use images of popular culture (most often through the use of irony) Recognise the silkscreen painting 'Campbell's Soup Cans' by Andy Warhol Recognise the silkscreen painting 'Marilyn Diptych' by Andy Warhol  Week 2 - Who is Lichtenstein? Know Lichtenstein as an American Pop Artist Recognise and identify some of Lichtenstein's work Compare Lichtenstein and Warhol's work Know/recognise Crying Girl 1963	To be able to design a piece of art based on pop culture or advertising that tackles a controversial topic To be able to create a single stencil background and foreground piece of art To be able to create a multiple stencil layered piece of art To be able to use a craft knife and cutting board with accuracy To be able to use stippling technique with a stencil and compare with normal brush strokes To be able to screen print a piece of art and compare with stippling To be able to use spray cans with a stencil To be able to critique their techniques at each stage and make suggestions for improvements To be able to keep a sketch book of ideas for their final piece, developing their ideas over time
