Activity	To understand a character’s feelings.  To find words with similar meanings (synonyms).	To consider how the tiger felt at different points of the story.  Can I use the 5 senses to explore the tiger’s feelings?	Can I write a letter to Augustus? Can you write a letter to give him some idea? How can he keep his smile?	Can I write draw an emotions map of Augustus’ journey?	Augustus’ diary  Imagine you are Augustus. Can you write a diary as though I am the tiger?
What to do	Look at the pictures of Augustus under the bushes and in the tree tops. Around the edge write as many feeling words as you can think of. Use a thesaurus or online to find other words with similar meanings. Can your adults tell you any more words?	Watch the story being told once more. This time pause the video after the ocean part to answer the questions. Think about the questions carefully. Do they make you want to ask more questions?	Think about how you could help Augustus. Can you write a short letter to explain how he could find his smile? Dear Augustus, I am writing to help you with your smile. I think if you look around you that you will find lots of reasons to make you smile. For example.....	Re-watch the story on video so that you know it very well. Record each stage of the journey on the map using a line that goes up and down depending on how the tiger felt at that part of the story.	NO SHEET NEEDED – do in book or paper  Write a diary about your journey. Include the places that you went and write about how you felt. Eg Dear diary, What a long journey I had. I hunted everywhere for my smile. First I searched under.....
Possible questions	How does he feel?  Can you describe this in another way?	How are the fish moving? What is it like to be there? What does it look like? How does it feel?	What could you tell him to look for to make him smile? How can you improve your writing? What can be added? What might you need to change? Is your punctuation correct?	What do you notice about the journey and his emotions?  Would it have been good if he had felt sad at the end?	How did you feel?  Where did you search?  Where did you go next?
