Answers

1. Name the two types of rainforest.

Temperate and tropical

2. In the fact file, the author mentions 'fresh water'. What do you think fresh water is?

Children's own responses, such as: I think fresh water is water that doesn't contain salt like seawater does. It is the kind of water that is found in lakes and rivers rather than oceans.
