8. Everyone is braver when they are in their own home.

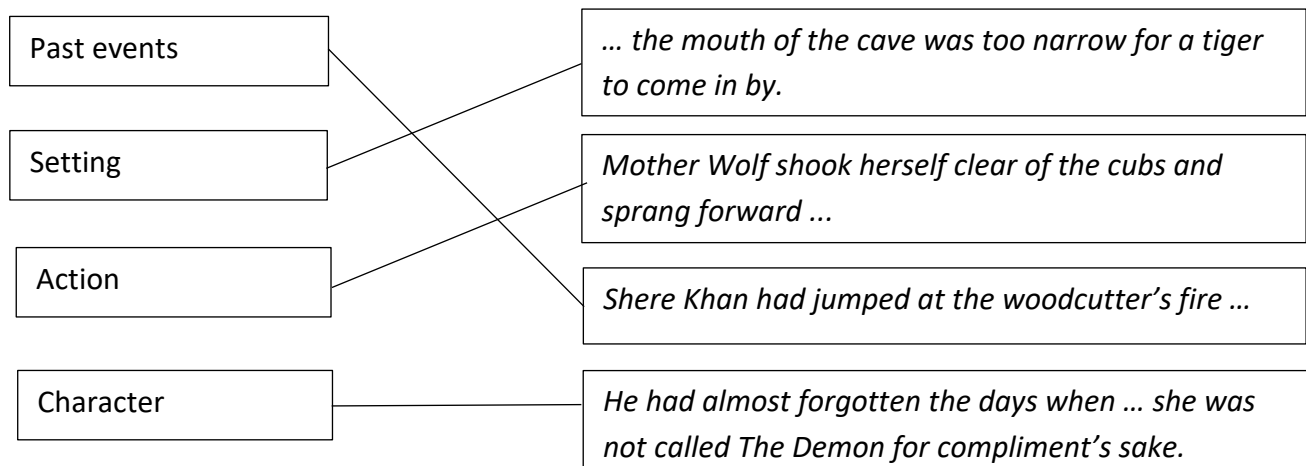
9. Because, even though he was alone, he was still bold and fearless enough to push one of the wolf cubs away from its mother.
