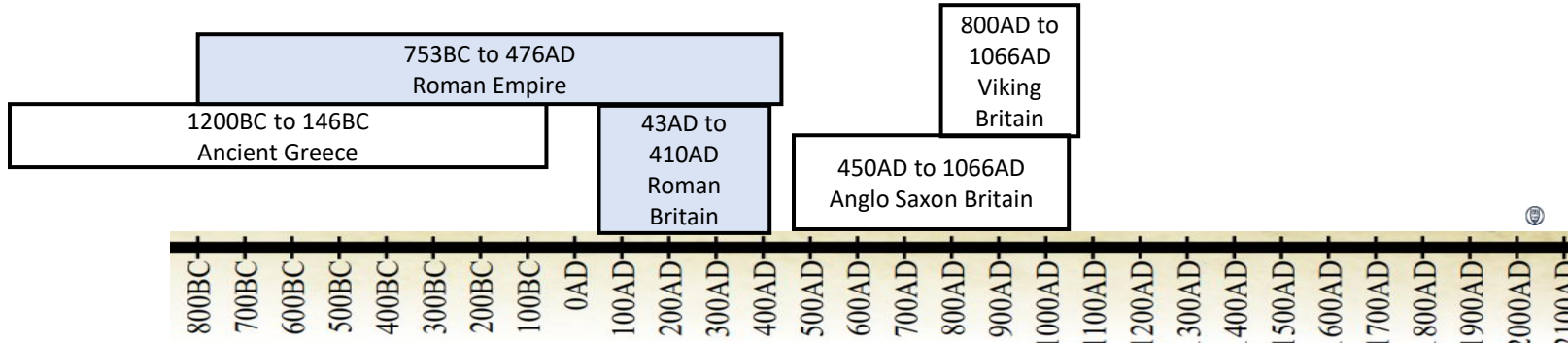


What did The Romans do for us? Year 4 Autumn 1

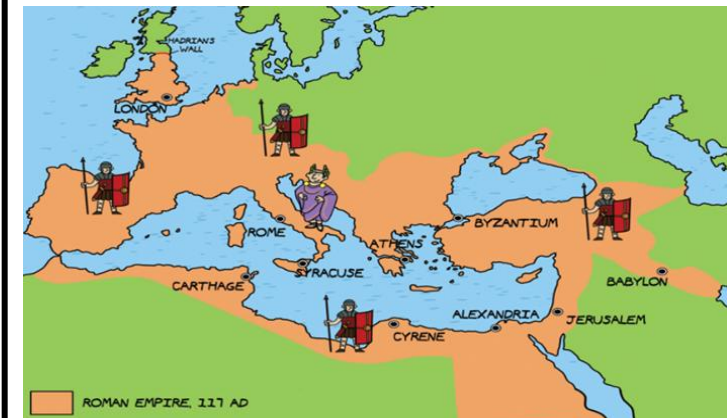
Army General – an officer of the highest rank

Conquer – to take complete control of someone else's land.
