Any religion and its teachings

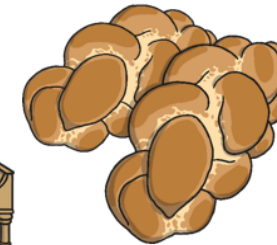
**Belief**
