Kingdoms – An area of land that is ruled by a king or queen.

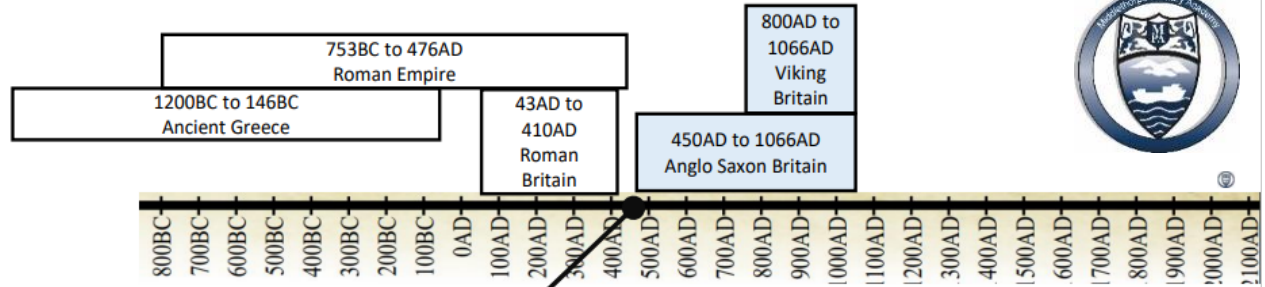
United – When something is made into one.

Culture – The quality in a person or society from what is thought to be excellent

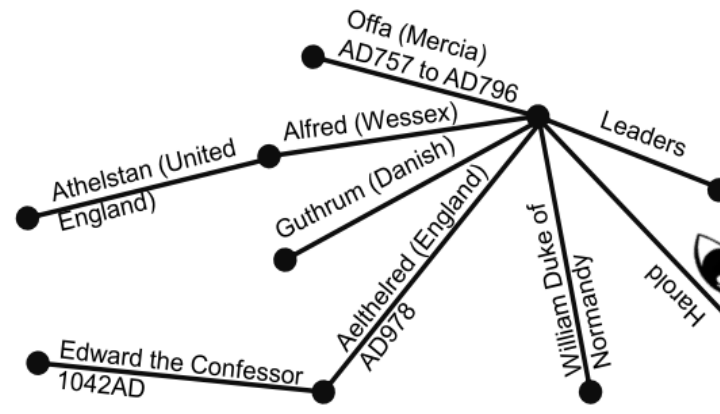
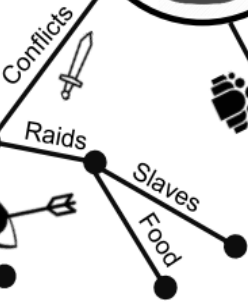
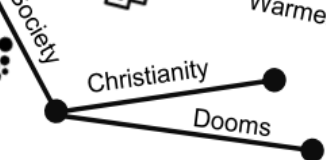
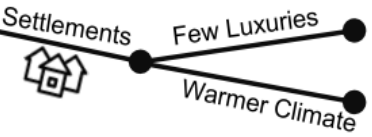
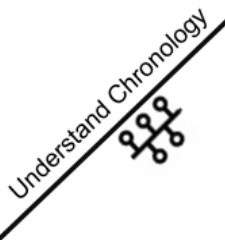
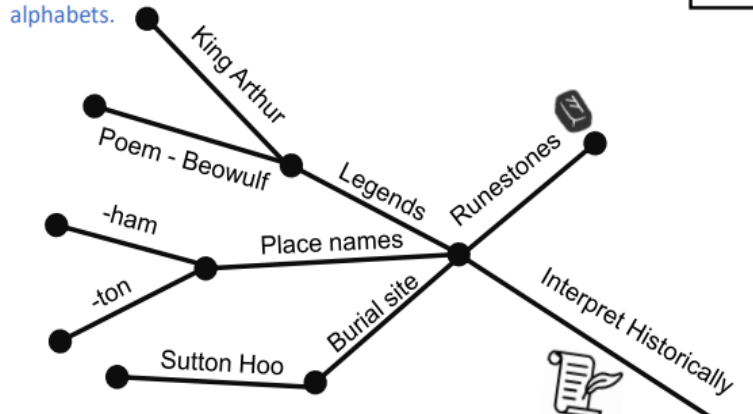
Christianity – The religion which follows the teachings of Jesus Christ.
