600 years ago, the first ships were powered by wind. Now, they can be powered by engines. The first bikes were invented over 100 years ago. A Penny Farthing had one large wheel and one small wheel. <p>George Stephenson invented the first steam powered locomotive over 200 years ago. It was called Rocket. Cars were invented 70 years later. <p>Powered aircraft was first made in 1896. 120 years ago, in 1903, Orville and Wilbur Wright's plane, Flyer, was the first manned plane to fly.
