Phonics

This half term in phonics we are going to be looking at rhythm and rhyme in phonics. This involves children listening carefully to words and pairing them with a rhyming



We will be using the weather and the change of seasons as our inspiration for our next stories in class. We will be looking at and using books involving wintery scenes and themes. Please let us know if your child has any favourite stories for this time of year.

Understanding the World

Winter will be our focus and how the weather can change the environment around us. We will be looking at how things freeze and how temperature can affect the world around us. We will be going on frost and ice hunts

We will be carrying out lots of small experiments involving freezing and melting liquids.



Outdoor Clothing

<u>Reading</u> Story time

At the end of every day, we all participate in a class story time. During these time we often share books that the children have voted for during the day. It is an opportunity to share new and old stories and enjoy a book together. It is a great way to end the day.

Reading Books

As you know we send out reading books every week but we can only do this if they are sent with their book bags. We change these books every Monday so that you can enjoy the book all week. We allocate time on the Monday to change the books and talk about their favourite parts of the book and what they have enjoyed about the book.

Reading is the key to open all doors to learning and enjoying a good book together now with your children really does set up strong learning foundations for the future.
