Key achievements to date	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:		
 Profile of PESSPA has been raised throughout the school through Ed Start, Commando Joe, Sports Week and Sports Celebration Assemblies. There is a broader range of experiences and sports on offer to children. Participation in extra-curricular activities has increased due to more lunchtime and afterschool clubs being on offer to the children. Children's teamwork, problem solving skills and behaviour have improved through the Commando Joe programme. All children are taking part in at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day through PE lessons, lunchtime clubs and extracurricular activities. Teachers' confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport has improved through the Ed Start teaching programme. 'Team Around a Sport' has increased participation in competitive sport. The PE curriculum has been updated and adapted in order to further support progression and overall attainment. 	 To ensure that the children who had their swimming lessons cut short due to Covid-19 have the opportunity to achieve the national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety. To continue to improve teachers' confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport through the Ed Start training programme. To focus on new staff members and staff members who feel that they need extra support with the delivery of certain aspects of the PE curriculum.
