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Summer 1 What's to come....

On April 1st, the government withdrew the guidance 'Actions for schools during the coronavirus outbreak'. Guidance on 'Emergency planning and response for education, childcare, and children's social care settings' and 'Living safely with respiratory infections, including COVID-19' is now available and as a school are working through this. We understand that COVID-19 has not gone away and therefore we are still maintaining enhanced cleaning, regular handwashing and good respiratory hygiene, whilst ensuring school stays ventilated and indoor large group gatherings return slowly. We now feel that the time is right to reduce the staggered start and end times that have been in place to reduce numbers gathering on the playground. The staggered start time will now be from 8:40am—8:50am and end time will be 3:20pm—3:30pm. Interventions will continue to take place in school at the start and end of each day, without the need for varying drop off and collection times.
