### Experience Pentecost

In classes, children completed a range of work to explore the Queen's reign and duties. The weekly highlights from 27th May shared information about classes work.

The whole school meet together twice, once for a garden party lunch and once to record 'A Life Filled with Grace', the song commissioned for the commonwealth.

The week's celebrations culminated in the Summer Fair! What a wonderful time we all had!

### Archbishop of York Sessions

The children in Year 4 have recently been given religious education lessons from Mr Maguire from St Anne's Academy. The themes and lessons have so far included courage and thankfulness. The lessons have featured people who have had to deal with situations requiring enormous courage such as the surfer Bethany Hamilton and Dutch World War 2 survivor Corrie Ten Boom. The work has been supported with bible stories and modern film.

### Sporting Events

It's been another busy half term with sports at Parish, with 12 teams having been in action: a total of 87 children representing team Parish! We've seen a huge improvement in our overall performances and this is down to the sheer work ethic and commitment of the children giving up their lunchtimes to practise for these events. For many events, we have even had to put in more than one team due to the increased number of children wanting to represent the school. Despite some close losses and a few semi-final defeats, 3 teams have walked away with bronze medals; the Year 5 girls netball team; the Year 6 boys netball team; and the Year 5 mixed rugby team, 1 team has walked away with silver medals; the Year 5 boys football team, and 1 team walked away with gold medals and a trophy; the Year 5 mixed rugby team.

We are extremely proud of all of these children as they give nothing but 100% at these events and represent the school ethos of Excellence, Truth and Grace.



### Pupil Voice

The **School Eco Group** had their first meeting this half term. Children from Reception to Year 6 met to discuss ways that we can help and support the environment at school and in the community. The group came up with some fabulous ideas such as litter picking and helping to educate through posters and videos on Class Dojo, planting more plants and trees and growing vegetables and fruit for school meals. We look forwards to the next meeting where we can begin the process of meeting the criteria for the Eco School award.

**School Council** have met to discuss returning to the hall to eat lunch. The council put together a question to hand out to classes to find out the pros and cons and get the wider child voice. Votes are due in after half term and the chair will take their findings to Mrs Wainwright to help inform her decision.

**Health Bodies and Mind Council** have considered new initiatives for classrooms to help manage stress and emotional health. They have also begun to survey children across school to find out what changes pupils would like to see at lunchtime. They are amazing at recognising the needs of different pupils in school and understand that not everyone likes sport; they are keeping that in mind as they plan new ideas. The Council are also keen to represent themselves at school events and are taking ownership of their own ideas. The Healthy Bodies and Minds Council will be talking to pupils across school and are looking forward to the work they will do in the future.
