Introduction

At Middleton Parish Church School, we recognise the responsibility we share with parents and carers to develop the behaviour and attitudes of our pupils. Our overall aim is to develop the behaviour, attitudes and habits of our pupils so that they grow into respectful, polite adults. Just like with learning in any of the subjects taught at school, clearly defined expectations of what we want our pupils to achieve are vitally important. This behaviour curriculum aims to define the behaviours that will be taught to all pupils of the school, so that they can demonstrate them at all times, with a clear understanding of why they are important and how they relate to our values of ready, respectful and safe. The content of the curriculum will be taught in all year groups across the school and regularly revisited to ensure all children have a clear understanding of what is expected. We will begin each school year with a particular focus on the content of this behaviour curriculum. The principles and expectations set out in this document will be followed by all adults in school as we recognise our role as role models to the pupils of this school.

Adaptations

While this curriculum is intended for all pupils in school, it will be applied differently in different year groups depending on pupils' ages and/or individual pupils' needs. Individual adaptations will be communicated to all staff, the child and the child's parents/carers. Decisions on adaptations will be made by the Senior Leadership Team, including phase leaders.

Curriculum Content

Our Behaviour Values

Our behaviour curriculum is based on our three behaviour values of **ready, respectful and safe**. Pupils will be taught the meaning of these values and all adults will refer to them when speaking about behaviour, whether it be positive or negative. If these school values are not followed then there will be a consequence as detailed in the school's behaviour policy.

READY

We follow instructions promptly.

We are eager to learn, with the correct equipment

We arrive to school on time, in full uniform with our book bags and water bottles

We listen carefully to the teacher

We work hard on tasks given

RESPECTFUL

We have good manners, always saying please and thank you

We listen to other people's ideas and opinions

We wait patiently for our turn

We help other people when they need it

We talk and act kindly to others

SAFE

We always use kind words, hands and feet

We sit sensibly on our chairs

We talk to an adult if we are worried

We always tell the truth

We help keep the school tidy, look after our school and its equipment

We move around school safely and calmly

Moving Around School

- Know to walk around the school using '**excellent walking**'.
- Know that '**excellent walking**' means facing forwards, walking at a steady pace, in a straight line and without talking.
- Know that you should walk on the **left side** of the corridor.
- Know that '**excellent walking**' helps to keep everyone safe in school and that learning in classrooms is not disrupted by people moving around the school.

Classroom Routines

- Know that good listening means facing towards the person speaking, sitting up straight and not interrupting when someone is speaking.
- Know that good listening applies to both adults and children when someone is speaking.
- Know the order that you line up in.
- Know that you should line up in a straight line (one behind the other), be still and be silent.
- Know that you should enter and exit classrooms quietly.
- Know where you sit in class (including 'carpet places' and seating for different subjects).
- Know the routine for handing out and collecting exercise books.
- Know that you should go to the toilet at playtime or lunchtime where possible
- Know that you should look after any equipment you are given.
- Know that if you deliberately damage school equipment then there will be a consequence.
- Know to put your 'quiet' hand up if you have a question or you want to contribute to a discussion.
- Know to ask an adult before getting out of your seating during learning time.
- Know that if an adult raises their hand (team stop) you must stop speaking and listen to the adult
- Know that if an adult says 'magnet eyes' then you should make sure you are looking at the adult

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that adults will use the 'talk your partner signal' when they want you to talk to your partner ● Know that an adult will use the '1,2,3 signals' when they want you to stand up, move around the classroom and sit down or when lining up in class.
Speaking aloud in Class	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that you should try to answer in full sentences when appropriate ● Know that you should try to pronounce words clearly so they can be heard by everyone ● Know that you should try to speak in a clear voice so that you can be heard by everyone in class ● Know that when you speak to a partner in class it should be at an appropriate volume
Work in Books	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that each piece of work needs a date and learning focus (LF) ● Know that you must use one digit in each square when writing in maths books ● Know how to underline dates, titles and the learning focus with a ruler ● Know how to correct mistakes by drawing a straight line through your work ● Know to use purple pen when making corrections/edits or when the work in books is guided by the teacher

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that work in books should be presented to the best of your ability at all times ('every piece of work is my best piece of work')
Manners	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know to use 'Sir', 'Miss' or the member of staff's surname and title when talking to a member of staff ● Know to say 'please' when asking for something ● Know to say 'thank you' when receiving something ● Know to say 'excuse me' when someone is in your way ● Know to use 'pardon' instead of 'what' ● Know to hold the door open for others
Playtime Behaviour (including lunchtime play)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that you must play safely without hurting anyone. ● Know that you should not 'play fight' because you may hurt someone by accident. ● Know that you must be kind, by including people in games and sharing equipment ● Know that you should treat others how you would like to be treated ● Know that you must use the play equipment as it is intended to be used so that it does not get damaged ● Know that you should inform an adult on the playground if there is a problem or if someone needs help

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that when the first whistle is blown you should stand still and be silent and when the second whistle is blown you should walk silently to line up ● Know that you should line up in the line order for your class ● Know that you should line up in a straight line (one behind the other), be still and be silent
Lunchtime Behaviour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know where to sit in the hall when you are eating your lunch ● Know that you should use quiet voices in the hall when you are eating your lunch ● Know that you should use your knife and fork correctly when eating your lunch (younger children will be taught how to) ● Know that you should finish eating your food before leaving your seat ● Know that you should put any food waste or rubbish in the bins provided ● Know that you should pick up anything you have dropped on the floor and put it in the bins provided ● Know that you should use good manners when in the hall, especially when receiving your food from the kitchen staff and when talking to adults in the hall. ● Know that good manners means saying 'please' when asking for something and 'thank you' when receiving something

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know you put your hand up when you have finished eating and wait for a member of staff to check your plate and table
Preventing Bullying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that bullying is hurting someone on purpose repetitively (happens again and again) and can be physical, verbal or emotional ● Know that bullying can include leaving people out of groups or games, talking about someone behind their back and standing by and watching someone get bullied without letting an adult know. ● Know that if bullying happens online it is called cyberbullying ● Know that if you think you are being bullied or you think someone else is being bullied then you should tell an adult ● Know that bullying is not tolerated at Middleton Parish and will be dealt with seriously by all adults in school.
School Uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that in EYFS and Year 1 pupils' uniform consists of a white polo shirt, or a white shirt, a school cardigan or jumper as well as grey school trousers and plain black shoes.

- Know that in Years 2 to Year 6, pupils' uniform consists of a white shirt and school tie, red sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo, grey school trousers, shorts, school skirt or a pinafore dress, black or grey socks, black, white or grey tights or socks and plain black shoes.
- Know that in summer grey polo shirts or red checked summer dresses can be worn
- Know that all shirts must be tucked in.
- Know that long hair must be tied back.

Jewellery

- Know that pupils are not allowed to wear jewellery in school except for plain silver or gold earring studs and a small wristwatch for health and safety reasons.
- Know that these items should be removed by pupils themselves before PE lessons and swimming lessons, again for health and safety reasons.

PE

- Know that for PE pupils must wear a red or white t-shirt (with or without the school logo), black shorts and black pumps if doing PE inside.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● If PE is outdoors, know that pupils must wear plain grey or black leggings or jogging bottoms, a grey Parish hoody and outdoor black trainers. ● Know that pupils come to school on their PE day dressed in their PE kit.
End of the Day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that pupils must wait quietly at the end of the day so their name can be heard when their parent/carer arrives to collect them. ● Know that pupils must not go home until the teachers have checked it is the correct adult collecting them. ● Know that those children in Year 5 and Year 6 who bring their mobile phone to school (phones must be switched off during the day) must only collect their phone as they are leaving at the end of the day. ● Know that children who have permission to walk home must leave the school premises quietly and sensibly at the end of the day.
Attendance and Punctuality	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Know that you must try to attend school every day so that important learning is not missed. ● Know that you must arrive at school before 8:50am every day.

Behaviour Outside School	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Know that when you are wearing your school uniform you are representing the school community and must behave as we would expect you to when in school.● Know that you should be considerate of other people when coming to and leaving school● Know that being considerate when coming to and leaving school means walking not running, giving people space and using a quiet voice (not shouting).● Know that being considerate means to think of other people's needs, wishes and feelings.
