English Reading

This half term in reading, we are going to be reading "Stick Man" and "The Christmas Story".



Writing

In writing, we will be writing a letter to Mr Brown, recounting our forest school experience this half term. We will also be writing a retell of the nativity story to go and tell the story to our friends in FS1 and FS2.

Outdoor Shoes

To ensure all children can engage fully in our playtime provision, we ask that old, sturdy trainers and a pair of football/walking/thick socks are brought into school in a plastic bag. These shoes will be used for Forest School and field games such as football. Ideally, we ask that these are left in school Mon-Fri.



Science

Our science topic this term is 'Animals including humans' and 'Seasonal change'. We will be learning all about different animals and the structure and classification of groups of animals according to their structures. We will also learn the language herbivore, carnivore and omnivore.



Reading

Class Novels

This half term we will be reading lots of different books about school.

Reading Books and BoomReader!

All children will take one or two books home that support the phonics learning taking place in class and the level that they are working at. Some children will also receive a share together book; these books contain words that cannot be decoded using phonics knowledge but they are great to support vocabulary development. Please share these books with your child.

All books should come into school and back home each day to maximise reading opportunities. Children have a vocabulary book which is kept in school and tricky words are added to and recapped to ensure understanding of words.

Adults in school will read with all children at least once a week. We ask that children read at home daily.

All reading should be recorded on Boom Reader in order for children to earn maximum gems! Problem words/new vocabulary can be added on go read.

History

In History, we will be learning about changes that have occurred since the children were born. This includes changes within themselves and their own lives. Also changes in national life such as the Covid 19 pandemic and Queen Elizabeth dying in 2022.

PSHE

Our Heart Smart topic is 'Too much selfie isn't healthy'. The children will be thinking about others as well as themselves and making sure we also consider how our actions might affect others around us.



Religious Education

In R.E. we will be learning about what it was like when Jesus was alive and comparing it to the present day.
We will then move on to learning about Christmas and learning about why this is such an important time in the Christian calendar.



Maths

In maths this term we are looking at addition and subtraction. The children will be using part whole models and 10 frames to help them to add and subtract numbers using resources and pictures. We are continuing to work on our arithmetic skills by knowing number bonds to 10 and doubles within 20.
