## **English**

This half term in reading, children will read a variety of different texts to answer a range of different style comprehension questions. We will pay particular focus on answering questions, which require the children to give pieces of evidence from a text.

## Writing

In writing, we will be using the book '1066: The Norman Conquest' as our stimulus. We will be writing our very own historical narrative based on the period of time surrounding the Battle of Hastings and also writing newspaper recounts.




### **Outdoor Shoes**

## **Science**

Our science topic this term is 'Animals Including Humans.' We will be learning all about the basic parts and functions of the digestive system in humans, the different types of teeth that humans have and also how to construct and interpret different food chains identifying producers, predators and prey.



## Reading

### **Class Novel**

This half term we will be reading 1066: The Norman Conquest

I Was There... 1066 tells the thrilling story of a young page boy at the heart of the Battle of Hastings. Edwin risks everything to infiltrate the Norman army and find out William of Normany's plans for King Harold.

## **Reading Books and GORead!**

Children have been loving our replenished class library and will continue to select books from it, with the guidance of the teaching team.

Should children have a home reading book they would like to read, please send it into school for teachers to check it provides enough challenge to support progression in reading – teachers will then add this book to GORead.

Adults in school will read with all children at least once a week. We ask that children read at home daily.

All reading should be recorded on GORead in order for children to earn maximum gems! Problem words/new vocabulary can be added on go read alongside in vocabulary books.

## **Summer 1 2022**

#### History

In History, we will be learning all the Anglo-Saxon Kings of England and the struggle for power including who Edward the Confessor was and what happened after he died including The Battle of Hastings.

#### P.E and Forest School

#### **PSHE**

Our Heart Smart topic is 'No Way Through.' In this topic, we are thinking about what we can do in a situation where we find ourselves stuck or struggling. We will learn the importance of having perseverance and not giving up just because we might find something tricky.



## **Religious Education**

In R.E. we are looking at the topic 'God, David and the Psalms. We will be learning all about David, why he is special and retelling some of the Bible stories that he appears in. We will also be considering their own values and the values of others.



## <u>Maths</u>

In maths this half term, children will continue to learn about decimals thinking about how to order, compare and round them to the nearest whole number. The children will also begin learning about money and using their problem solving skills to add and subtract different amounts and find the amount of change someone might need.

We are continuing to practise our times tables and your support with this at home is very important as we prepare the children for the multiplication check, which will take place in Summer 2.
