English Reading

This half term in reading, we will be focusing on the skills and techniques needed for SATs in preparation for the tests in May. This will mean looking at a range of questions based on retrieval, words in context and inference. We will use a range of fiction and non-fiction texts including past SATs papers.

Writing

In writing, we will be using Shakespeare's Hamlet as a stimulus for writing for a range of purposes from letters to play scripts.



Geography

The key question which leads our Geography learning this half-term is 'How does our food get from field to fork?' The children will look at trade routes, Fairtrade. Globalisation and how and why good are imported and exported to and from the UK.



Maths

In maths this term we will be revising topics linked with shape such as area, perimeter and volume, angles and properties of shape. We will also continue to revise all aspects of the key stage 2 curriculum in preparation for SATs. Please ensure that you are supporting your children at home to complete any homework set and to ensure they are fluent in their recall of times tables facts.



<u>Reading</u>

Class Novel

This half term we will be reading Cloud Busting by Malorie Blackman. Davey is the new boy in class and Sam can't stand him. He thinks Davey is a Grade A moron. But when the two are thrown together Sam discovers that Davey's eccentric way of looking at the world makes life a lot more fun. Until the day something terrible happens...

Reading Books and Boom reader!

Boom Reader is back! As we begin the second term, it is as important as ever that children are reading at home every night. Children can do this independently and log what they have read on the app. Staff at school will then ask questions about the text before books are changed and children will need to

complete a book review.

Should children have a home reading book they would like to read, please send it into school for teachers to check it provides enough challenge to support progression in reading – teachers will then add this book to boom reader, which was previously Go Read.

Adults in school aim to read with all children at least once a week.
