Millbrook Primary School Home/School Agreement 2024/2025

By accepting a place at Millbrook Primary School you agree to support the aims and values of our school. This home-school agreement is a statement explaining them, the school's responsibilities towards pupils, the responsibilities of the pupils' parents, and those of the pupils themselves.

The school will provide:

A safe, well ordered and caring environment where learning can take place

A place where each child is respected, inspired and valued as an individual

An environment where every child can achieve excellence and fulfil their potential

A broad, balanced and creative curriculum for all pupils

Work matched to the need of each child to both engage and challenge

Regular communication with parents/carers about progress and performance, both formally and informally

Activities to be completed at home that are appropriate to the age and ability of the child An ethos where everyone is valued and all forms of discrimination and bullying are not tolerated

The parents/carers will:

Support the school and their child in 'Achieving Excellence, Fulfilling Potential'

Support the school ethos and behaviour policy, including the 'Purple Promises'

Ensure their child attends school every day and that any unavoidable absences are authorised in advance

Ensure their child arrives at school on time and in good health

Notify school every day of any absence (by 9.00 am that day)

Ensure their child attends school (and that any unavoidable absences are authorised in advance)

Support their child's learning at home

Participate in discussions concerning behaviour, attitudes to learning, progress and attainment

Ensure correct school uniform is worn at all times, including PE kit uniform

Collect their child from school at the correct times

Give careful consideration to the content children see online and ensure children are not allowed to access non-age appropriate social media
