We are really pleased with the way that the children have settled into Reception. They have enjoyed exploring the classroom and making lots of new friends. We will be **starting P.E** when we are all full time (**week commencing** <u>20.09.2021</u>). Your child should come to school <u>dressed in their P.E. Kit</u> on a **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**.

Please could you make sure that your child has a **named pair of wellies** in school. If your child attended Caterpillar Pre-school and their wellies no longer fit them, please take these home. They can be found just to the left of the Ladybird classroom doors in the outside area.



From today, Ladybirds and Bumblebees will be staying for lunch. We will do a dinner register each morning where your child will let us know if they are hot dinners or packed lunches. Hot dinners do not have to be pre-booked or paid for.

This term your child will be taking part in the **Reception baseline assessment**, which is a practical and interactive assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills. The assessment is used by the school to inform planning to move children's learning on and by the DfE to measure the progress schools make with their pupils. The assessment will be carried out on a 1-1 basis with either your child's class teacher or the EYFS Phase Lead within the first 6 weeks of your child starting school.
