Quest Title: All Creatures Great and Small

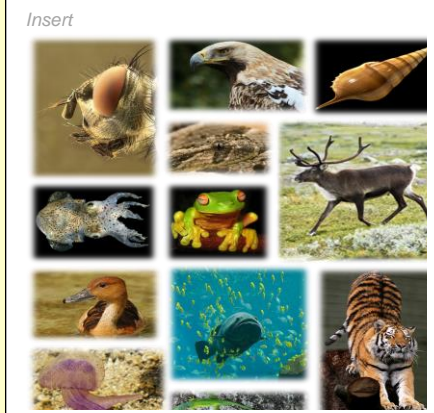
We Care, We Aspire, We Belong
