As geographers:

We will build upon our prior knowledge of maps to develop field skills including how to use a compass, understand how and why to read directions and deepen our knowledge on different geographical sources such as maps and the symbols used on different maps.

As mathematicians:

We will begin to build the foundations of multiplication and division and fractions, learn about position and direction and advance our understanding of place value with numbers up to 100. We will also be learning about money and time.

As design and technologists:

We will further develop our knowledge of healthy and unhealthy foods and explore where our food comes from, as well as developing our cooking skills by making a savoury dish.

As scientists:

We will continue to explore seasonal changes as well as further develop our knowledge of plants by exploring the structure of plants and what they need in order to flourish. We will deepen our scientific skills needed to gather information as well as expanding our scientific vocabulary.

As linguists:

We will begin by writing exciting finding tales linked to the wonderful story of The Storm Whale, progressing to creating beautiful weather poetry. After half term we will get to grips with writing instructions to coincide with our plant work.
