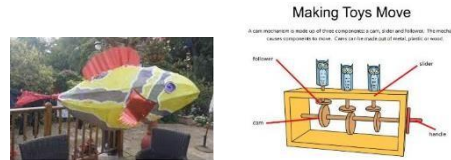
We Care, We Aspire, We Belong

These words underpin the ethos of our school and the teaching and learning that takes place. We strive to ensure all children care for their community on every level, aspire to be the best they can be and most importantly, develop a strong sense of belonging here at Milverton Community Primary and Pre-School.

We care by: working with and learning from our school community. We do this through responsibilities such as being class representatives, post people and reading buddies.

We aspire by: respecting our education (including homework), participating fully in all activities and by developing an idea for our future careers.

We belong by: showing positive learning behaviours, supporting the school with its aims, being polite, well-mannered and by participating.



As historians: we will study Charles Darwin and the impact he had as a scientist. We will study his travels on the Beagle, his findings and his theories. We will learn about Alfred Russel Wallace and Carl Linnaeus.

As geographers: we will study the climate zones of the world, biomes, time zones, the equator, the tropics, longitude and latitude and the Arctic and Antarctic Circles, the Prime Meridian and the Greenwich Meridian.

As mathematicians: We will use a variety of maths concepts to design and finance an imaginary zoo.

As design and technologists: we will study cams and use them to make moving toys. We will also design and make picture holders using a variety of resources and tools.

As scientists: we will learn about evolution, classification and adaptation. We will learn about life-cycles, reproduction and what we have learnt from the fossils that have been discovered.

As linguists: we will read, write and speak for a variety of purposes and to a range of audiences. We will write a variety of texts for a variety of purposes. We will learn how to write adventure stories, biographies and information texts.

Our learning adventures

We will learn about zoos, their use and form opinions about them. We will complete a zoo project, with the children taking control of an imaginary budget to design and create their own zoo and enclosures, calculate all of the costs (from given information) and advertise it in a variety of ways. This will bring many features of this term's learning together in one project. We will participate in our next Forest School session, see the BSO in concert, prepare for camp and perhaps visit Paignton Zoo.

As artists: we will carry out a variety of process work in order to create a large class sea-scape for our upcoming Milverton School Gallery. We will learn how to use a variety of materials and techniques to create both 2D and 3D images. These will include collage and willow sculpture.

As musicians: we will be learning songs for our visit to the BSO concert 'Exploring the Orchestra: Sea Stories'. We will learn body percussion to a given concert piece and participate with other schools.
