
	Maths: 20 minutes	Literacy: 20 minutes	Other	Ongoing

Day 1	See if you can find 20 pieces of 'treasure' in your house. They could be sparkly stones, sequins, buttons or sweeties! Count them carefully to make sure you have the correct number. Using the part-part whole model at the bottom of this document, see how many different ways you can separate them, with 20 as your 'whole'.	 Buried Treasure Game: You will need a 'treasure chest' and a 'bin' (pictures or pots will do). Keep these for later in the week. Write these words onto circles of paper to make 'coins'. beard, pure, night, hair, mearg, nure, bighm, jair, vet, jam, gox, for, vor, boat. Then add them to the treasure chest if they are real, or put them in the bin if they are NOT real words. 	Science: Pirates love to hunt for shiny treasure, which is often made from metal. Find a magnet in your home and use it to see what you can find in your house that is magnetic. Do the magnetic objects have anything in common? What do you notice about the things that are not magnetic?	Reading: 10 mins Phonics: Watch this episode of Alphablocks to practise the 'igh' sound. https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/e pisode/b01py5bs/alphablocks- series-3-16-tightrope Number: Can you order the numbers from 1-10 correctly?
Day 2	Have a go at making your own pirate telescope, using a cardboard tube or a piece of rolled up paper. Can you decorate it using a repeating pattern? Then have a go at playing 'I Spy' using numbers. E.g 'I spy with my little eye, the number 10.' Or 'I spy with my little eye, 3 blue things'.	Today, have a go at setting up your own treasure hunt. Choose something special to hide somewhere around your house. It could be a special snack, a new story to read or something special for your family. You could even make your own treasure chest! See if you can write some clues or draw pictures for people to follow. You could even make your own pirate map to follow, with labels.	 PE: Have a go at building an obstacle course in your garden or home, where you have to walk the plank like a pirate! See if you can balance walking on a straight line, without falling over! You could use string or a chalk line to follow. Challenge: Can you balance on a wiggly line too? Can you tip toe along it? 	Reading: 10 mins Phonics: Watch this episode of Alphablocks to practise the 'oa' sound https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/e pisode/b01py5gz/alphablocks- series-3-17-toad Number: Count from 1-20, taking care with teen numbers.

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Day 3	Buried Treasure Game:Using your treasure chest and binfrom earlier in the week, play buriedtreasure using these mathsquestions. Write them onto paper'coins' and work out if they arecorrect or not. The right ones go inthe treasure chest, the wrong onesin the bin.3+4=74+4=96+4=1010-2=412+3=1520-2=185+1=611-1=104-1=5	Sometimes pirates send messages in a bottle. They write something special and then seal it in a bottle before sending it out across the seas. Can you write your own message in a bottle to someone? Maybe you could write a story about a pirate adventure to a desert island, or a letter to your grandparents to tell them about what you have been learning about, or a hello message to your friends?	DT: Have a go at making your own pirate ship, using a plastic tub, bottle or corks. Think about the design of your ship. Will it have windows? What shape will they be? A good ship will need a mast and a sail. All ships have a name. What will you call your ship? Test out your ship to see if it will hold 5 pieces of treasure. Day 4	 Play a Pirate game! At the bottom of this document, there is a pirate version of snakes and ladders that you could play. You will need counters and dice. Alternatively, you could play 'Pop Up Pirates' if you have this at home, or have a go at the 'Swashbuckle Games', choosing the board game version. https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/ga mes/swashbuckle-the-great-pirate-games 	Have a look at this picture of a desert island. Can you write a sentence or two to describe what it looks like? Don't forget capital letters, full stops and finger spaces!	Art: Have a go at drawing your own pirate and ship using this video, or design you own! Day 5	If you need to, use today to have a 'catch-up day' to finish off any of the activities that you have not managed to do so far this week. If you have finished everything, you could have a go at this challenge today: Make your own time capsule! Time capsules are a way to store memories from times gone by and share what your life is like with people in the future. Choose 5 things that are special to you and take photos, or draw pictures of them. You could write a special letter to your grown-up self about what life has been like at home over the last few weeks. Add them all to a box and either bury it in your garden or hide it somewhere in your house to open again in 10, 20 or even 30 years time!				


If you do not have a school writing book to record work in, please use any paper that you have available at home.
