

How to say 'I play' + sport in French

1. Je joue **au** foot ('le' changes to 'au')
2. Je joue **aux** cartes ('les' changes to 'aux')


How to say how often you play a sport in French:

1. 'Le' + day of the week, e.g. Je joue au foot **le** mardi = I play football on Tuesdays.
2. The time expression usually goes at the end of the sentence, e.g. Je joue au foot **tous les jours** = I play football every day.

In pairs, translate the following sentences:

- a) I play tennis on Mondays.
- b) I play chess on Wednesdays.
- c) I play rugby every day.
- d) I play snooker often.
- e) I play basket ball from time to time.
