Over the past few weeks, Years 5 and 6 have been making scale models of our Solar System. The planets we made were Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn and even Pluto! We were put into groups and allocated a planet or planets to make. We used our mathematical skills to scale down the planets so that they were accurate in relation to each other. We used sugar paper to draw our planets, as it is larger and more sturdy. We scaled down our models by around 200,000,000cm. Jupiter still ended up being 80.4cm! Once we had cut out our planets, we painted them the correct colours according to books and websites we had access to. Finally, we stuck the two halves together and hung our planets up on our washing lines in the classroom. See if you can spot Mercury! We have really enjoyed making these scaled models of our Solar System and we think they have turned out splendidly. by Hannah and Jessica, Year 6
