Class R had an interesting morning learning all about bones and teeth when Natasha from South West Heritage Trust came in to visit. Natasha spoke to the children about different types of teeth and what they are used for. The children were involved in activities such as closely observing and sketching skeletons and identifying bones from different models. The children also had the opportunity to see inside themselves using an app—they could see their own skeletons and internal organs!



On Wednesday, 2 teams from Class 6 took part in an annual Kingsmead School Science Quiz. The quiz was part of British Science Week. The title of science week was 'Change and Adapt'. We met at Kingsmead at 4pm and the quiz lasted an hour. There were 3 teams in total; 2 from Milverton and 1 from Wiveliscombe. There were 5 rounds in total and my favourite round was the magnification round. In this round we were shown photographs of animals and plants magnified hundreds of times and had to use our identification skills. One of the strangest rounds was the picture round of animals that had been photoshopped together to make strange new animals! We had to decide which animals they were made of. Each round was marked by Kingsmead students and we had to wait until the end to find out who had won. In the end it was a draw between the Einsteins of Milverton (my team) and the Wiveliscombe team. We then had a tie-break question; if you had an HB pencil and drew a continuous straight line, how many miles could you draw until the pencil will runs out? We replied 10 miles and Wiveliscombe replied 11 miles. The answer was 35 miles! So we came 2nd and the other Milverton team came 3rd. We all had chocolate eggs as a prize.
