Dear Parents and Carers,

The Coronavirus situation is changing daily; I thought it timely to update you. We are following the advice from government. We are increasing hand-washing amongst children and have installed two hand sanitizers on site: one at the main school gate and one outside the school entrance. I encourage adults to use them on entering and leaving the premises. I have delivered an assembly about correct handwashing with the children to encourage them to do so. If your child shows cold-like symptoms, **please send them to school with pocket-sized tissues** so that they can prevent the spread of *whatever* they are suffering with. Face masks for the general public, pupils, or staff are not recommended to protect from infection, as there is no evidence of benefit from their use outside healthcare environments.

On Monday the Department for Education launched a new helpline to answer questions about COVID-19 related to education.
