In Class 5, we have been revisiting our learning on Victorians to design a moving toy that uses a cam mechanism. Children designed their toy with both the structure and appeal to other children in mind to ensure they were creating a suitable product. After research and planning, children made their mechanisms to enable a figure or character to move up and down when the crank is turned, before decorating using card, paper, pens and paint to be of interest to their target audience. Class 5 then tested their moving toy to ensure the mechanism works appropriately. *Miss Downer*

This week, half of Class 5 took part in Bikeability. This is a two-day bike safety course aimed to help us be confident cycling on the road. When we went on the road we learnt how to u-turn and signal with our left and right hands. I was so happy when we went on the roads because I loved going uphill. On the second day of training before going out for the ride, we learnt about different road signs and what they mean. We checked our bikes using the ABCCD method: A-air B-brakes, C-chains, C-control and D-drop. We learned about how to control your bike, including setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. We also learned about being aware of our surroundings; looking behind and turning around obstacles.
