

Class 3 and 4 visited the Roman Baths this week as part of their Quest learning this term. The children used their morning to take part in several investigative workshops where they explored various aspects of Roman life ranging from digging up Roman artefacts to experimenting with building Roman arches and cranes. In

the afternoon, the children got to explore the baths for themselves, seeing them up close, speaking to live actors and exploring even more artefacts that were on offer. A huge well done to all the children for their enthusiasm for learning and their excellent maturity

and kindness while in a public space. Also, a big thank you to all our parent helpers that kindly volunteered their time! Miss Downer





Everyone was excited when we got there. We went into the basement and became mini archaeologists digging for artefacts. We had to recreate Roman arches and did some activities like dressing up as Romans and creating our own mosaics. We saw the Great Bath and it was massive! We couldn't go in because there is algae in the water caused by the sunlight. We could see the steam rising from the hot water. The floor was very uneven, so we had to be careful. We visited the hot room (the caldarium) and the cold room (the frigidarium) and learnt how Romans used to clean themselves. The Romans built a Great Temple next to the Sacred Spring, where naturally hot water at a temperature of 46°C rises every day for thousands of year. This was dedicated to the goddess Sulis Minerva and Romans threw many objects into the Spring as offering to the goddess. When someone else had done something bad to them, they would scratch a curse on a piece of metal and throw it into the Spring. Class 4


















OUTSTANDING LEARNERS OF THE WEEK

This week, Mr Coupe challenged Class 5 with making many different machines with the Lego WeDo kits. On the first day, we made windmills. We programmed them to move. We next made a science rover called Milo. It had a sensor on the side to sense an object so that it could stop. We made a moon







buggy the next day, one that could collect things in a scoop AND turn around! After 45 minutes of building we could programme it to scoop up space junk and turn it so it faced in a different direction. We also made some technical Lego and made a complete simple gears and
