This week I was lucky enough to host Class 1 at our Forest School, working on our reimagined Blue Cedar area, making nettle soup and playing happily in the rain! After our usual catch-up and discussions about the weather, we began, as ever, with 1,2,3, Where Are You. The children think that this is all about hiding in devilishly tricky places and stifling giggles as I stumble blindly past, but in fact (don't tell them) it's a cunning plan to get them to merge quietly with nature and have a moment or two of gentle soli-



tude and observation alone in the woods, followed by joyous shouts of "I've found youuu!" Many of us felt a great sense of loss when last year, amidst all else that was happening in the world, our cherished house tree, the Blue Cedar, died unexpectedly. But from the cedar's death comes opportunity for new life as the cleared space is now open to sunlight and the opportunity for a crafting plantation and creative zone. The children of Class 1 have chosen a habitat to hang on the monolithic stump of the Blue Cedar - who knows what life may move in to it! We went on to trample down as many nettles as we could, following professional advice that this will help prepare the ground for our sapling planting. Following a quick training session on dock leaf poultices we went on to pick juicy nettle heads and add them to a base soup of secret ingredients that only Class 1 and I know. As the soup simmered we drank hot chocolate, sampled vegan marshmallows (very nice) and played creatively until lunchtime. Thank you to Class 1, Mrs Bray and Mrs Cutler for a morning so marvellous we barely noticed that it was raining. What a fantastically kind and thoughtful bunch of people they are.
