

As you know, we moved to an online chess club a year ago and as the school year comes to an end I thought I would share some facts showing just how great you all are and what you have achieved!

- We have 22 online members in chess club,
- We have run 25 in club Swiss tournaments,
- We have participated in 8 interschool team battles. With an average of 37 primary school teams per tournament, our highest placing was 6th!!!
- We played 2 Swiss tournaments with Taunton school getting a 1st/3rd, then a 2nd/3rd and Taunton fielded pupils from year 8!!!
- We played 2 school battles with Taunton school, winning one and losing the 2nd by ½ a point, again Taunton fielded pupils up to year 8 to remain competitive.
- We participated in the Delancey Chess Challenge (largest chess competition in the world) with 5 children in the Mega Finals and 2 making it to the Giga Finals!
- You were invited to play in the English Chess Fedaration's National Primary School Championship. We ended up placing 6th overall and were ½ point away from 4th place!!!
- In this tournament the children were watched and listened to by international arbiters (chess referees) who also ran anti cheat software to make sure everyone played fairly.
- At the very end, the director of junior chess for the English Chess Federation sent me a private message complimenting all the Bad Bishops for their play on the day and their exemplary behaviour! Amazing!!!

Whilst the online chess has been superb I know you all want to return to over the board chess (OTB). Unfortunately, I am not able to run it regularly from September. I do want to add that you are all a terrific bunch of children and I have enjoyed teaching, playing and getting beaten by you and I really do hope you continue to play chess (feel free to challenge me on Lichess). But if any parent would like to run The Bad Bishops please let me know, I would still be able to support every now and again and can source all the sets/clocks required. Lastly a big thank you to all the parents who have supported the children over the last few years you are all great! Mr Beviss (Jamie)

We would like to say huge thanks to Mr Beviss, who has led the school's chess club 'The Bad Bishops' over the past years. With his knowledge and enthusiasm for playing and teaching chess, he has inspired many young players of all ages at school, and he has created a real team spirit amongst the children to collect points for their school team.
