
We created cartouche pendant designs and we also had a lesson in how to write hieroglyphics, before we wrote secret messages to each other.

The Colour Run is taking place on Friday 27th June!

The event is held during the school day and each class (including Pre-school) will take part in a fun

run around the school field. They can run, jog, walk or skip and will pass through the 'colour station' up to 5 times, collecting different colours on their t-shirts. We will be using powdered paint which is 100% safe and non-toxic. The product being used is skin, plant and environmentally friendly. The manufacturer advises that the powder is washable but can't 100% guarantee the possibility of clothing being left without a trace of colour. Therefore, we are asking children to come to school in old oversized tshirts they can wear over uniform. We recommend a white t-shirt so that the colours are seen, but any t-shirt is fine. We are also asking for a donation of between £1 and £5 per child. Please donate what you feel able—this will all go towards the MSA.
