Dear Parents and Carers,

We continue to adjust to school life in these difficult covid-times. Our guidance from Public Health England and the Department for Education about when a child should not come into school is clear, and we need your support to keep everyone as safe as possible. So, if your child has ANY ONE of the symptoms below, please keep him/her at home for at least 10 days or until they have had a negative Covid-19 test:

- A new continuous cough;
- A high temperature;
- A loss of, or change to their sense of smell or taste.

Their brothers or sisters must also be kept away from school or pre-school for 14 days, or until they have had a negative Covid-19 test result. Your child's teachers will supply websites for you to continue your child's education. If someone in the same household has a symptom, please test and keep your child/children home from school while waiting for the result. Please tell us as soon as you know the result of a test. For more information, please phone the NHS helpline on 119. Doing all of this will help us keep our school open, and the community as safe as we can. Thank you for your continued support.
