They enjoyed playing with a wide variety of old toys, dressing up in old fashioned clothes, looking at the materials toys used to be made of and how we can identify if toys are modern or from olden times. ### The Charles Darwin Experience

On Tuesday 22nd October, Class 6 enjoyed an experience all about Charles Darwin's theory of evolution. It was shown by the Ocean Conservation Trust (OCT.) The experience started and we were shown plants such as red mangroves. The sensitive plant that has a flower on it and when you touch it, it curls up to protect itself and also one of the things the sensitive plant can do is move. Secondly, we were shown different types of ocean animals such as: turtles, sharks, jellyfish and stingrays. Did you know? Jellyfish cannot actually swim and jellyfish's tentacles are actually green? Did you know that dermal denticles are small, tooth-like structures on the skin of sharks and rays? Did you know that the stingray barb is a sharp, venomous spine located on its tail? After the experience, we were given a sheet of paper to play two games, the first game was to draw a species of animal that we created and in the second game we had to roll a dice to see if we were fish, reptile or a mammal. On Thursday 24th October, some Year 6 pupils played a football tournament at Bridgwater and Taunton College. We all chose our Milverton football kit with Miss Storey and we left the school at 3pm. We went into our next game against North Town losing 4-0 and finally Wiveliscombe losing 3-1. We are all happy, though, because we massively improved throughout the games, building our teamwork up.

#### **PE Enrichment**

Year 4 took part in an Ultimate Frisbee enrichment lesson. The session focused particularly on learning the basic technique of both how to throw a frisbee with the correct technique and throwing with accuracy. The children then tried to knock a tennis ball off a stand from a distance. The children engaged in small sided matches throwing competitively within groups. The Year 4 pupils displayed excellent listening skills and the children all did well to embrace such a tricky sport, mostly a first time sport for them. The stars of the lesson were Harper and Tom who had a natural talent for Ultimate Frisbee. *Mr Aldwin* 

Reception Class took part in a throwing games lesson with a view to finishing with a game of Dodgeball in their enrichment lesson. The children learned rolling ball skills and underarm and overarm throwing techniques. The pupils then played 'Decorate the Snowman' to hone their throwing accuracy before an overarm power throwing game 'Knocking The Monkey Out of The Tree'. The children played a simple game of Dodgeball split into teams. The listening skills of the children, especially for Reception, were exceptional and all the pupils worked together well in teams. Amy, Lennox & Freddie all demonstrated super listening, were eager to demonstrate and displayed an awareness of power and direction in their throwing abilities.
