### ECO DAYS



On Monday, Class 5 and 6 had an Eco Day. First we made some bird feeders, designed by one of our Eco Committee members, Kitty, and these were made from recyclable items. Using an old plastic bottle and a butter container lid, we had a demonstration from Kitty who modelled the fantastic bird feeders. We had then made our bird feeders and carefully added the bird feed. Later on in the day we placed some of the bird feeders in the school grounds and some people took theirs home.

Our next eco session of the day involved Class 5 and 6 separating and focusing on our individual eco topics. Class 6's eco topic is water, so we began by revisiting our learning of the water cycle. We looked at the journey water takes and the process of it being cleaned. We had a virtual tour of the Wessex Water water-cleaning process through an animation. It was interesting to see how many stages the water goes through until it becomes safe enough to drink and arrives at our taps. We then took part in a practical experiment to see how we could use a sieve, with a range of filters, to filter the water using everyday items including: cotton wool, a leaf and a paper towel. We were successful in filtering the dirty water; however we do understand that it is not safe to drink until it has been through the water plant cleaning process! Overall, our Eco Day was a fun, active experience which we would love to do again.
