Our first week back after the half-term break has been a full one! The adults in school continue to challenge the children to reach new heights with their learning and the children have been responding admirably, as you can see from the reports in this week's flyer. This is testament to our revised curriculum, which the teachers have been working on for over a year now, and we are seeing the fruits of it this term. This will continue as we make further progress through the year, with ever deeper learning. This term we have been learning about Andy Warhol. We started our learning by doing an artist case study to find out information about him and then coloured his iconic Coca Cola bottles. Andy Warhol was a pop artist. Pop art is focused on modern popular culture including bold, bright colours. Pop art became popular in the 1960's and included silk screen-



ing and commercial printing. After learning about him, we made portraits with odd colours that didn't match our face but were a pop art style. We had a black and white photo of ourselves to trace the lines of our silhouette. We are really pleased with our portraits and know lots about him. We then linked our art learning with our Space quest learning and Miss Brown shown us Andy Warhol's 'Moonwalk' piece. We found out that the 'Moonwalk' piece was printed in 1987 and was based on a photograph that Neil Armstrong took of Buzz Aldrin standing on the moon in the first moon landing in 1969. Andy Warhol then changed the original photograph to a vivid pop art scene. We then recreated his work by creating a collage on the moon made from little pieces of ripped newspaper. We carefully arranged them with gradients of colour changing from white (where our light source would be) to black. We stuck the pieces of newspaper down and after it dried we traced an outline of an astronaut to make it look like it was standing on the moon. Then we coloured it a vibrant colour in the style of Andy Warhol and after we outlined it in a handwriting pen. It was really fun! We hope you like our work! by Isla.V, Missy and Susannah
