On a lovely Wednesday morning, a man who worked for the NHS came into school. We were so excited because he was going to be teaching us some things about First Aid, like the really important things that you would need to know if you found someone unconscious. We were told about **Dr's ABCD** and how important it is to remember what this means; D for **Danger** (check if there's any danger around the situation), R stands for **Response** (check if they are not just sleep

ing) S is for **Shout**, shout as loud as you can for help! A is for **Airway**, check that their airway is open, B for **Breathing** (checking that they are breathing), C for **Compressions** (CPR) and D for **Defibrillator**. We paired up and did these steps on each other (except for C & D!). Next, we practiced all those steps or inflatable dummies (including CPR). Before doing this we were told that if you are going to do CPR you need to remove some clothing, but if that takes too long there will be some scissors in the emergency kit to cut them off. Afte this, random people were picked to use the defibrillator on a dummy to see what it was like, I was amazed as they had never done it before and they did i so well. Finally, we asked a few questions about the things we were a bit unsure about.
