Our learning adventures

We will relate much of our learning this term to vibrant Mexico and we hope that it will help us to have an exciting and colourful start to the New Year. We are planning to be very creative and make beautiful art work and maracas that you will be able to see at our whole school Art Exhibition.

As historians: We will learn about a local historical landmark, the Wellington Monument and consider what life would have been like for local people during the time of the Duke of Wellington and the battle of Waterloo.

As geographers: We will compare our local area to a contrasting place called Tocuaro in Mexico.

As mathematicians: We will be learning place value for numbers to 20, and adding and subtracting within 20. We will also learn place value to 50, measure height and length, and measure mass and volume.

As design and technologists: We use papier mache to make our own maraca and decorate it in a Mexican style.

As scientists: We will continue to learn about the changing seasons, day length and how this affects living things. We will use our weather station to record the weather. We will compare our weather to that of Tocuaro Mexico. We will carry out some scientific experiments to help us understand the weather.

As linguists: We will continue to learn our phonics which help us in both reading and writing. We will practise our handwriting and learn to write correctly punctuated sentences. We will write our own version of fictional and non-fiction text based on familiar texts we have practised together.

As artists: We will be developing our sketching skills and trying out different dry media including charcoal and oil pastels. We will learn how pictures are made from lines and shapes, we will apply this to make our own pictures of Mexican serape blankets. We will learn about the Mexican artist Frida Kahlo and make a self-portrait in her style.

As musicians: We will be listening to traditional Mexican mariachi band music, playing along with our own maracas and clapping.
