### What Plants Need to Grow

#### To grow properly, a plant needs:

- air;
- light;
- · water;
- nutrients;
- · warmth.

#### Why does it need them?

- If a seed is not warm enough, it will not germinate.
   Germination is when the seed starts to sprout.
- If a plant does not have enough light, it will grow to be tall and flimsy as it tries to search for light. The plant will probably die.
- If a plant is not watered enough, its stem will be fragile and it will have very dry leaves. Again, it will probably not survive.
- So, where is the best place to grow a healthy plant?
