End of Term

The last day of term is Friday 12th July. We will be finishing school early:

- Year 7 and 8 will be dismissed at 12.30pm
- Year 9 and 10 will be dismissed at 12.35pm

Start of the Autumn Term

The next school year starts on Tuesday 27th August

- Year 7s should be in school by 8.35am
- Years 8 -11 should be in school by 10.45am

Term Dates 2024/25

The term dates for the next academic year are attached to this letter. The pattern is very similar to previous years. Schools have now been given more freedom on the positioning of staff training days in the school year. The overall number of days in school for students remains the same: 190 days.

I would like to draw your attention to the dates of three staff training days which will fall during term time. The school will be closed to students on those dates:

- Friday 27th September
- Friday 29th November
- Monday 31st March or Tuesday 1st April This day will coincide with the celebration of Eid, parents will be notified the evening before the closure day.

Start of the School Day 2024/25

The doors will open at 8.25am, **but we will expect students to be at the school gate by 8.30am**. This is to allow registration/lessons to start promptly at 8.35am. Students that arrive after 8.30am will be marked late. When a student is marked as late, they will receive a detention on that day. You will be informed by text if that is the case.

We ask for your support in ensuring that students arrive on time. Punctuality is a vital life skill to develop whilst at school.

There is a huge amount of evidence that this type of Whole Class Reading improves reading ages and leads to increased enjoyment of reading.
