Science

General

We will explore these in a variety of ways including art, sewing and even food.

French – Eurostar's programme- Unit 4- Portraits

Music- Traditional and cultural music- using voice and percussion

<u>PSHE-</u> Our well-being focus continues as we move through this difficult time. This will be supported by our Heart Smart programme, where we will be exploring the unit- Don't rub it in, rub it out, the focus here is on forgiveness and how to show we are sorry. We also look at discrimination linked with our topic, looking at the history and progression of civil rights both in the US and the wider world.
