Term 1 - Movers and Shakers

English

Phonics as ever will continue to be a focus for class 2 as well as early reading skills. The children will be grouped again for Little Wandle reading and phonics groups and these will commence as soon as assessments have been completed. Children will bring home a small blue book on a Monday with spellings to learn for the week, these will then be tested the following Monday and you will be able to see the results at the back of their spelling book.

Our English lessons will be linked to our Movers and Shakers topic and will see the children spending a couple of weeks on biographies, then newspapers and finally posters. They will then build their knowledge and skills over the two weeks before completing a longer piece of writing where they can show the knowledge they have acquired.

As a class we will be reading a non-fiction style text about Rosa Parks as well as enjoying James and the Giant Peach by Roald Dahl as our class reader.

Science

Human Survival - This project teaches children about the basic needs of humans for survival, including the importance of exercise, nutrition and good hygiene. They learn how human offspring grow and change over time into adulthood.

Maths

This term predominantly focuses on Place Value where children will learn the best ways to count and sort objects, to write numbers as digits and words as well as compare numbers. They will also start to complete different number lines and count in 2's, 5's and 10's. We will then move onto addition and subtraction when the children are ready where they will look at the language linked to addition and subtraction, fact families and number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 as appropriate for each year group.

General

Welcome back to Class 2 to all those children and families returning to us and a very warm welcome to those new to Class 2 this term.

We have lots of new learning this term with new topics and activities and hopefully a very early school trip to learn about some local significant figures for our topic.

Our first topic is called Movers and Shakers. This project teaches children about historically significant people who have had a major impact on the world. They will learn to use timelines, stories and historical sources to find out about the people featured and use historical models to explore their significance.

Programming animations - This unit introduces learners to on-screen programming through ScratchJr. Learners will explore the way a project looks by investigating sprites and backgrounds.
