## Wet Weather Clothes - it still rains in the Summer!

To put it simply, waterproof clothing is integral and therefore now part of our uniform policy.

Children must have their own waterproofs (do not have to be red). In order to experience wet play, children must have waterproofs on in order to avoid getting their uniform wet, muddy and uncomfortable.

#### This should consist of:

- Waterproof jacket
- Waterproof trousers
- Welly boots
- Change of socks

The waterproofs opposite can be purchased from Asda for approx. £10 depending on size
