Mrs Bax was delighted with our drawings and writing. This week- it's foxes!





This term Class 2 have continued their learning on Movers and Shakers. Last term we learnt about inspirational people and explorers such as Gandhi, Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus. This term we have been looking at Activists such as Rosa Parks and Emmaline Pankhurst which has gone hand in hand with our Christian Foundations. We have focused on the courage they had to stand up for justice and their compassion for others. As we move through the term we will be learning more about the world around us and focusing on atlas and map work. We are now focusing on Humans and how to keep ourselves fit and healthy. At the end of term we will be using all of this knowledge to cook a healthy meal in DT, where we will be peeling, mashing, grating and slicing a range of vegetables.

This has been such an amazing term with such fantastic learning, trips and events. All that and still our Christmas trip, Nativity and Christmas activities to look forward to.







Class 3 have enjoyed lots of hands on learning to explore their current curriculum topics about the Anglo Saxon and Viking invasions of Britain. We were lucky enough to explore a wonderful treasure box of Anglo-Saxon artefacts, bringing the past to life in our hands!

We've made an excellent start to Ukulele lessons (despite some tender fingers!) with three chords under our belt already and preparations are underway for our first performance in the New Year.

We've also made good use of our fabulous outdoor areas with forest school and science investigations into biodiversity at Monkton.
