
School Notices

Pupil Absences

Can we just remind all parent/carers that if your child is ill, please **telephone or email the school office before 9:am on each day** of absence unless other arrangements have been made. We also kindly remind you that when you need to take your child out for appointments/early pickups or late arrivals you notify the office directly. This ensure everything

Change to time away from school for vomiting and diarrhoea.

Historically, at Monkton CEP School, the expectation has always been that there should be 48 hours from the last episode of V&D before returning to school. At Minster, they operate a 'clear day' policy. This allows children to return a little earlier, providing they are well enough, meaning they miss less school and working parents can get back to work. There is no evidence that shows operating this policy increases the spread. Therefore, we will now be operating this policy at Monkton.
