

Catch Up Premium

What is The Catch Up Premium?

The Catch Up Premium is government funding delegated to secondary schools to ensure that all children who did not achieve 'secondary ready' levels at the end of primary school can catch up during year 7. The government gives this funding to support intervention in reading or maths for students who do not reach the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 2 in either reading and/or maths.

How much Catch Up Premium money does our school receive?

The total sum for the period September 2017 to August 2018 was £14,820

The anticipated sum for the period September 2017 – August 2018 is expected to be £12,241.

How is the money spent and what is the impact?

2017 – 18

57 students qualified for Catch Up Premium for reading and 45 students qualify for Catch Up Premium for maths and of these 27 students qualify for both.

Impact:

On Track Data for the End of Year 7:

English Language: 3 Above, 31 On Track, 18 Below, 3 Cause for Concern

English Literature: 4 Above, 39 On Track, 11 Below, 1 Cause for Concern

Maths: 1 Above, 18 On Track, 15 Below, 7 Cause for Concern

Lexonik:

£3060 was spent on a six week Lexonik programme which was delivered to 18 Catch Up premium students who were not making accelerated progress on the Accelerated Reader Programme (paid for from the Disadvantaged budget).

Of the 18 students 14 made progress (measured by a WRAT test at the beginning of the six weeks compared to a WRAT test at the end of the six weeks), 2 students stayed the same and one student went backwards. 16 of the 18 students had a reading age that was Functional (above 9.5) at the end of the

programme, 4 had a reading age in line with their actual age and 6 had a reading age above their actual age.

Accelerated Reader:

19 of the 57 students who qualified for Catch Up Premium students still require intervention for reading (through the buddy reading scheme, through the weekly extended assembly, and through their Accelerated Reader fortnightly lessons) due to having a reading age below functional (9.5). All other students reached a functional reading age or above.

2018 – 19

75 students qualify for Catch Up Premium for reading and 63 students qualify for Catch Up Premium for maths and of these 47 students qualify for both.
