Governments have safety rules and laws in place to reduce the risk of disasters occurring.

Sometimes a natural disaster is beyond our control. It is how we respond during and afterwards that is important.



How does facing disaster change us?

Following the trail of devastation left by Hurricane Ida across parts of North America, US President Biden declared that ‘historic investment’ is needed to deal with the impact of climate crisis. He has blamed climate change for what’s happened and believes the country needs to be better prepared for extreme weather. Hurricane Ida tore across more than 1,500 miles of the USA and was one of the most well-forecast storms in recent memory, causing catastrophic flooding and destroying buildings in its wake. Biden said he would be pushing for action on his Build Back Better plan, which would see investment in infrastructure, including modernising roads and bridges and improving energy grids, water and sewage systems.

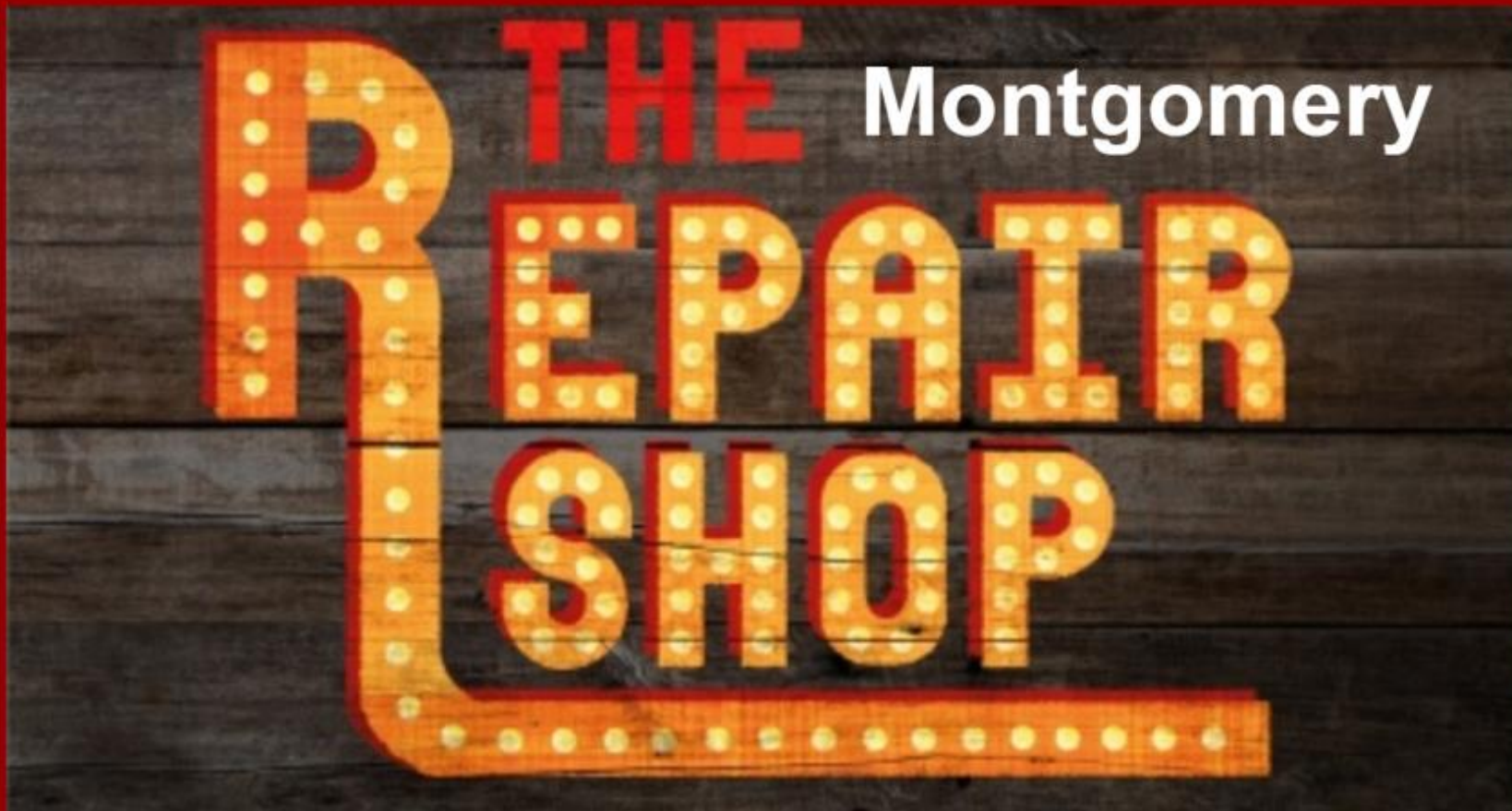

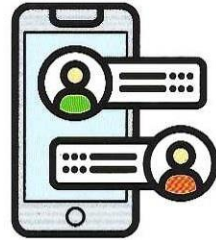
