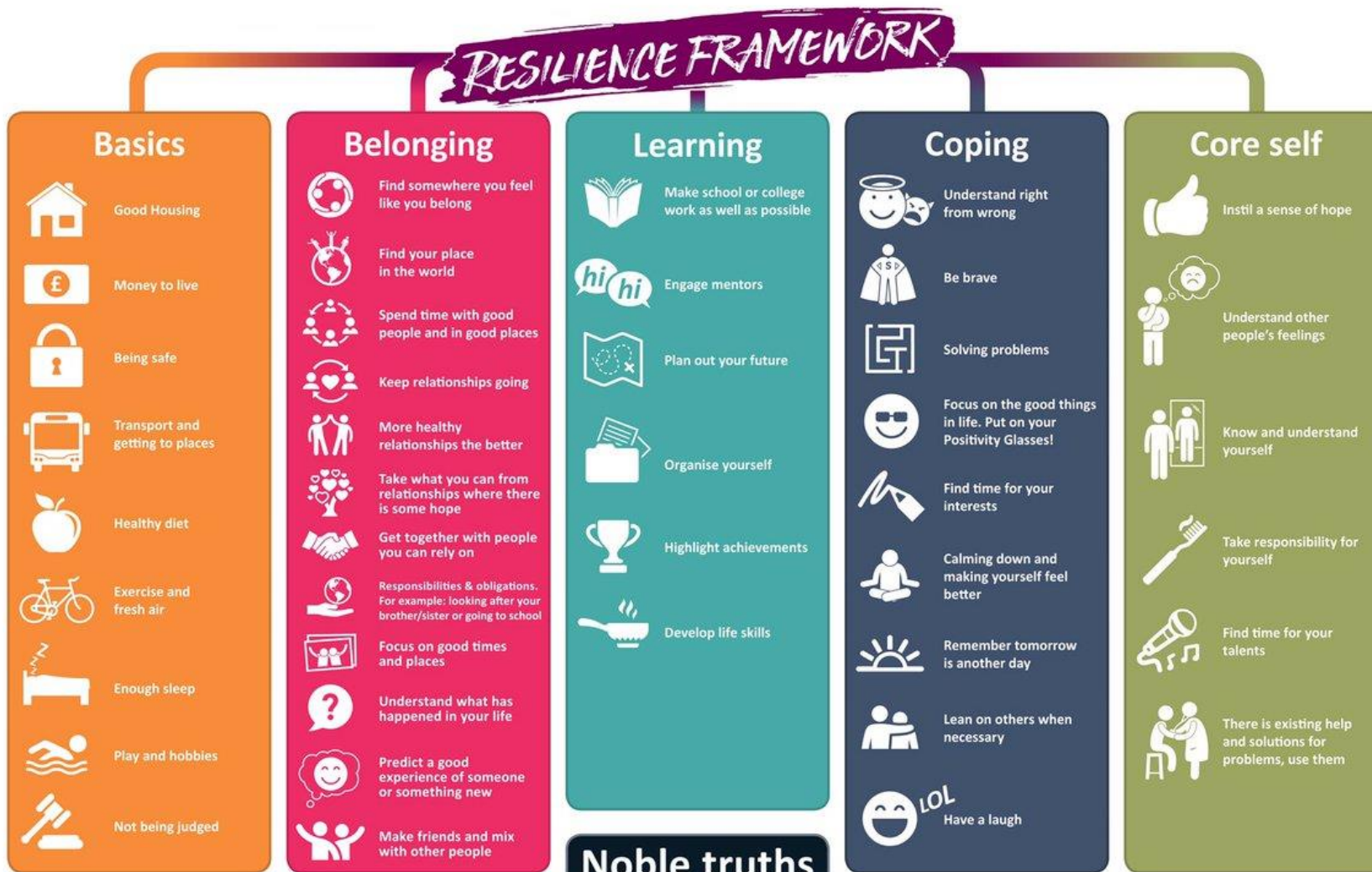

We all have different living arrangements, with some people not having a home at all. There are many reasons for the different circumstances in which people live; it is important to show equal respect to all.



How can we help those without a home?

A number of charities, including Streets Kitchen and the Glass Door Homeless Charity, are campaigning for empty commercial buildings to become makeshift shelters this winter. They are predicting that there will be an increase in the number of people who become homeless over the coming weeks and months, due to increases in job losses caused by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The economic effects of the pandemic, and the social distancing measures in place, mean that fewer people will be able to shelter in existing accommodation.

The charities are currently awaiting further guidance from the government with regards to the opening of night shelters this winter; a spokesperson for the mayor of London has said guidance would be issued to clarify social distancing rules in the next few weeks.

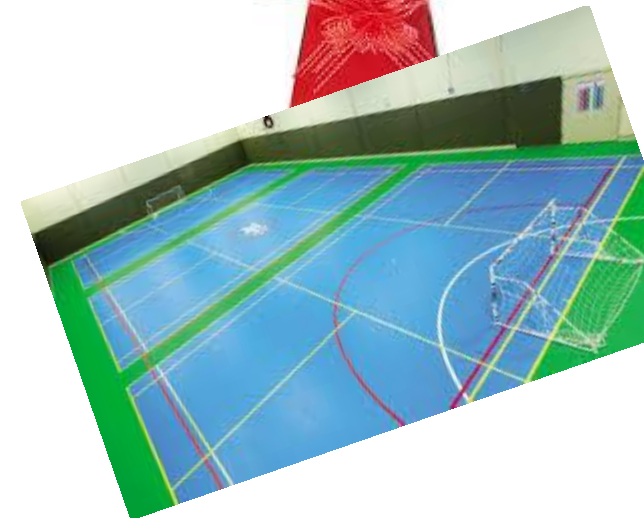
