



Rule of Law

There are laws in place so that people use e-scooters safely. If e-scooters become more popular in the future, laws may have to change to protect members of the public.



Question: Should e-scooters be allowed on our roads?

The electric scooters, also known as e-scooters, are now available to rent in selected areas of London as part of a one-year scheme to measure their feasibility. As part of the trial, conducted by TFL (Transport for London) and London councils, the scooters are banned on pavements and limited to 15.5mph. Privately owned e-scooters remain illegal on most roads and cycle lanes due to a law dating back to the 1800s. Anyone who does ride their own scooter could face a fine and 6 points on their current or future driver's licence. The 12-month scooter trial will allow the government to test whether they could offer cost effective travel that could ease the burden on the transport network and provide another green alternative. More than 40 UK towns and cities, including Birmingham and Manchester, have already been taking part in a government e-scooter trial after the change in law.
