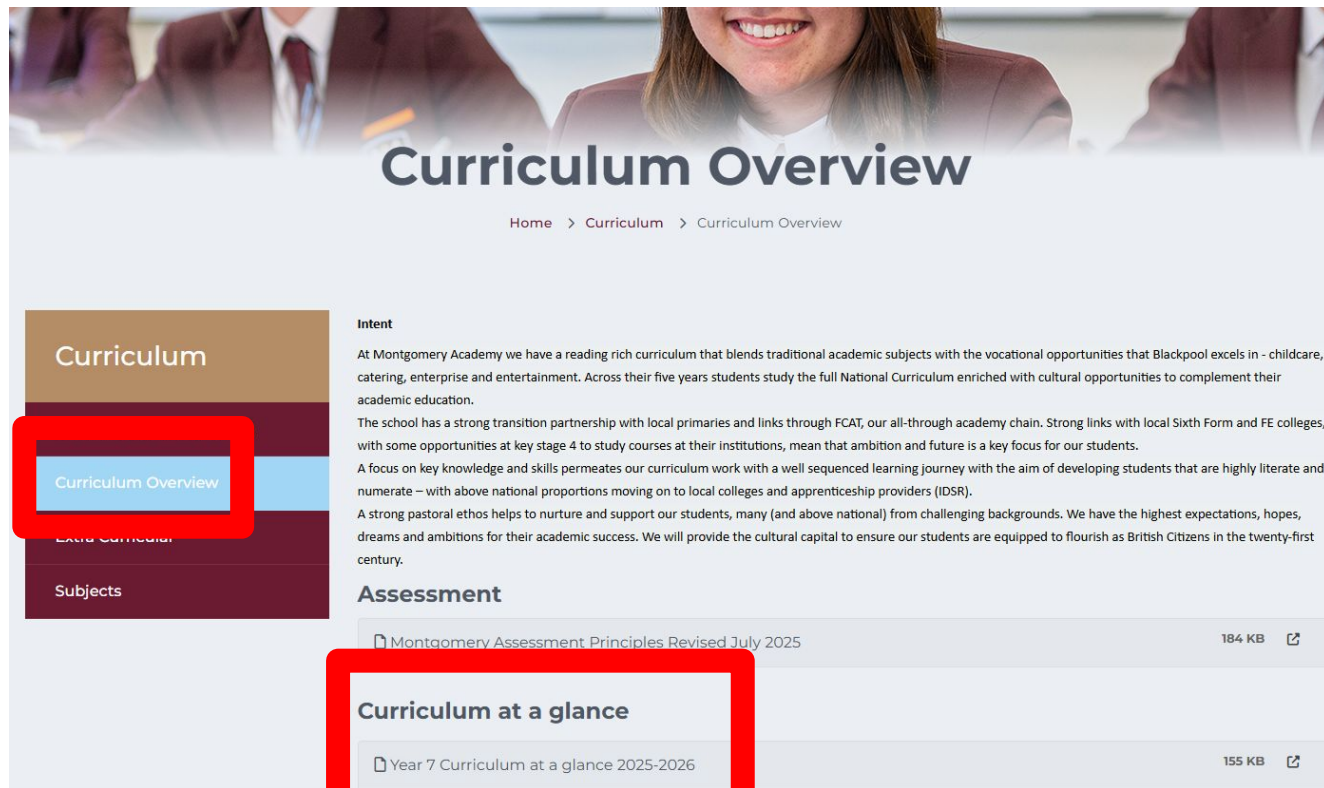

We will provide the cultural capital to ensure our students are equipped to flourish as British Citizens in the twenty-first century.

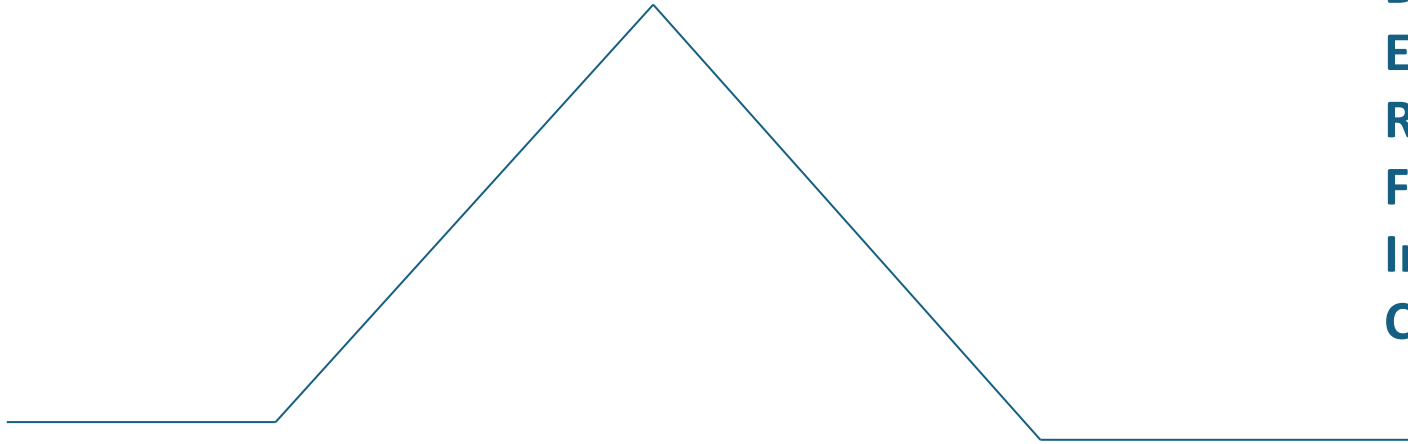

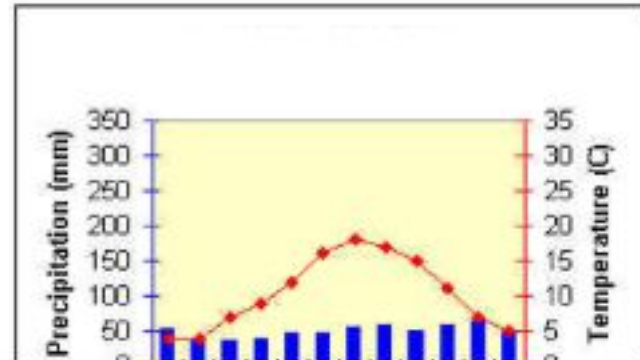

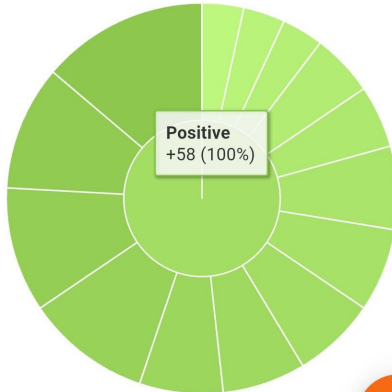

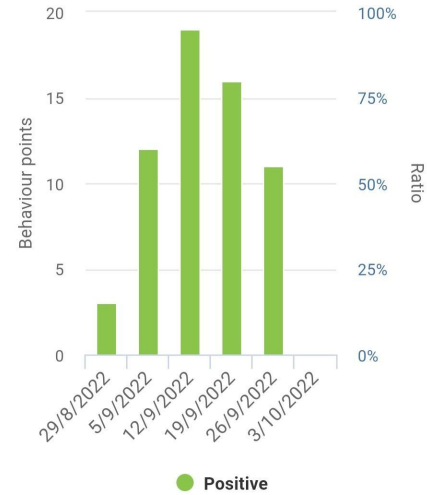
Behaviour score breakdown
