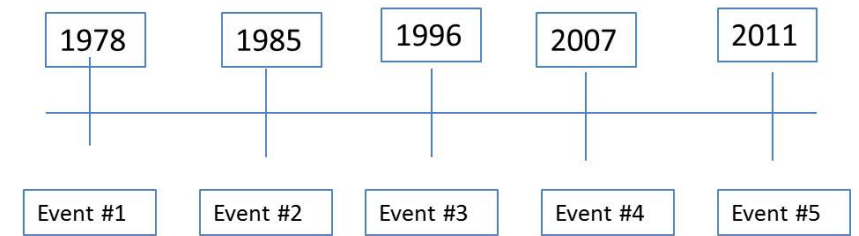

- **Chron**ological – arranged in the order that events/things happened
- Syn**chron**ise – to occur or cause to occur at the same time
 - Hint: 'syn' means together

- **Chronic** – serious and long-lasting; recurring and difficult to change or solve

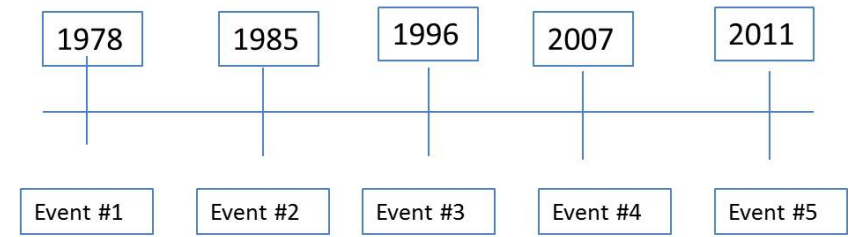
